



This morning, in worship, we looked at what objects and famous figures had in common. The final group, Martin Luther King Jr, Rosa Parks, Gandhi, Malala, William Wilberforce and Emily Pankhurst, are all historical figures who are renowned for standing up for themselves and others.

Then we shared the story of David and Goliath: the boy who stood up for himself and others against the giant – Goliath. David knew that if he had God's help he could defeat Goliath. This led us to self-reflect on what problems we currently have, how aware we are of other people's and how we can bring them to share with God. Finally we shared our mission for this week: to try to stand up for ourselves and others without hurting others.
