Forest Schools

As some of you may be aware, Year 5 have been thoroughly enjoying their trips to Peel Park Primary School every Thursday to take part in Forest School activities. Next half term, Year 3 will benefit from this outdoor learning experience which will take place every Thursday afternoon up until Christmas. Please note, that every class in KS1 and KS2 will take part in Forest school at some point in the year. It is hoped that the teachers and children attending Forest School will bring back new skills and knowledge to then continue their outdoor learning back here at St Francis.
