# **'TOGETHER WE ARE GROWING TOWARDS GOD'**

Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners,

Just before we broke up for the half term holidays, we all joined together in worship to prepare ourselves for the season of Lent. The children helped Mrs Haines to set up our new worship table with a purple cloth for the season of Lent. They helped to choose some symbols to go on the table which all represented different ways of preparing ourselves for our journey with Christ through Lent. We then discussed Ash Wednesday, which took place during the holidays, and it's significance as the official start of Lent and how the ashes help us to remember our mortality and our duty to 'repent and believe in the Gospel'. We ended by using our hands as 'Gods mirror' to help us reflect on ourselves. We noted one thing that was good about ourselves and one thing we would like to improve.

Yesterday, our worship centred around the idea of



temptation. The children shared some of things they are giving up or doing for Lent and we discussed how we might find some of these things difficult to stick to for the whole of the 40 days of Lent. We reflected on the story of Jesus in the desert for 40 days and 40 nights. We noted the significance of how Jesus was tempted three times by the devil, but on each occasion he resisted the temptation and turned away. During Lent, we will try to gain inspiration from Jesus' time in the desert and try to stick to the Lenten promises we have made. Each class has been invited to take part in forty simple acts of generosity which will challenge them to 'do Lent generously' in 2018. These are challenge cards which children can choose from each day during Lent to try to fulfil. The children were set their first challenge yesterday which was to give someone a compliment. Please look out for the children doing these positive challenges each day.

### Lent

Throughout Lent, we will be offering voluntary Lenten prayers at 8:20am every Thursday in the small hall for children, parents, families, parishioners and staff. Please join us if you can. Each Wednesday morning worship, we will be introducing a station of the Lenten Labyrinth which will be set up in a particular area in school for children to visit throughout the week. This week, we start with our first station 'Preparing to Join Jesus on His Path', which will be set up in our Peace Garden. In the last three days of the term, during Holy week, the full Labyrinth will be set up in the ICT suite for parents, families and parishioners to visit. We will give more details of this nearer the time.




# Reading Rocks Week
